### **LINDA ALLEN**

Linda Allen is one of those rare performers who combines story and song into a rich and generous flow. She sings the songs that tell of the lives and the work, the hopes and the dreams of people everywhere. Her songs are rooted in tradition and honed by years of commitment to an art that both informs and transforms.

Linda has over thirty years experience collecting stories, writing songs and performing with seven recordings to her credit. She has organized two community folk centers, and has toured extensively throughout the US and beyond. She serves on the national executive board of Local 1000, the Traveling Musician's Unions. She's published two collections of Washington songs and frequently appears in schools with workshops on Washington's history. Linda recently received her doctorate with a dissertation on helping disempowered women find their voices. Linda frequently teaches workshops and offers keynote addresses at conferences, seeking to empower others to find their physical and creative voices.

Celebrating her 60th this year and the release of her newest CD, Where I Stand, with a series of concerts, Magnolia warmly welcomes Linda Allen.

### **ZAZOU**

Zazou is a sextet featuring accordion, lead and harmony vocals, string bass, rhythm and lead guitars and percussion. Their repertoire, including original material, is inspired by the sophisticated melodies of French Jazz Manouche, Parisian Musette, Latin American popular songs and American Swing Jazz. Drawing together a multitude of musical influences and incorporating the driving European "string swing" rhythm, Zazou pays homage to music of the past while creating an original sound that is contemporary and exciting.

In addition to their diverse musical repertoire, Zazou also puts on a entertaining show that encourages audience participation through humor, magic and playful stage banter.

### **Electric Shades of Blue**

Mark performed with The Springfield Rifle Band, a local favorite for years. In the 1980's Mark joined Ron Ussery and Mike Rogers to form the Sweet Talkin' Jones Band. Mark spent three years conducting and arranging for The Seattle Women in Rhythm and Blues Show. Many bands came after that: Bitterroot, O.K. Fine, Duo Glide, The File Gumbo Zydeco Band, Dos Pecos, The Fabulous Cyclones, The Muscletones, and many many more!!
